The Sierra Leonean Diaspora will stage a global protest on 27th April 2026, to demand democratic reforms and the full implementation of the Tripartite Committee's recommendations as outlined in the Agreement for National Unity (ANU).

ABOUT ONE SALONE

One Salone is a peaceful civic movement comprised of concerned Sierra Leoneans at home and in the Diaspora, and we officially announce a coordinated global protest scheduled for 27th April 2026.

The movement welcomes members from across the globe, particularly those who believe in electoral reform, transparency, and national unity, especially the fundamental principles of ethical democracy essential for a better Sierra Leone.

This demonstration will take place simultaneously across multiple cities in the United States, Europe, and various global cities within the Diaspora. Therefore, "One Salone" is calling on the **Bio-led SLPP Government of Sierra Leone (GoSI)** to honour its reform commitments without further delay.

The objective of this movement is to urge the Government of Sierra Leone (GoSL) to transparently and fully implement the Tripartite Committee's Recommendations in the best interest of the nation. The decision to organise these protests derived from the government's perceived negligence, reluctance, and continued delay in executing the reforms agreed upon by the All People's Congress (APC), the GoSL, and the moral guarantors of the Agreement for National Unity.

By implementing these recommendations, Sierra Leone's national electoral system will be reformed, ensuring that future elections are free, fair, and credible. On 27th April 2026, the One Salone Movement will make our voices heard through peaceful protest to raise awareness within the international community at large.

CORE DEMANDS OF THE PROTEST

To ensure comprehensive electoral reform in Sierra Leone, our core demands to the Government of Sierra Leone (GoSL) are as follows:

1. The immediate and full implementation of the Tripartite Committee's recommendations.
2. Impartial Justice, equal justice for every Sierra Leonean, without the targeted harassment of the main opposition party members.
3. To maintain electoral Integrity. Meaning, the removal of the newly appointed ECSL Chairman Mr Edmund Alpha due to the President's failure to follow proper tripartite recommendations procedures.
4. To respect the Rule of Law and put an end to politically motivated arrests, intimidation, unlawful detentions, and the perceived undermining (bastardization) of our national constitution.

PROTEST LOCATIONS

Confirmed protest locations include Washington, D.C., London, and other major cities across Europe and Africa with significant Sierra Leonean Diaspora populations.

On the day following the protest, we intend to formally deliver a "Letter of Demand" to the Sierra Leone Embassy in Washington, D.C. Similar deliveries will be made to embassies in other cities on separate dates, adjusted to accommodate local Independence Day celebrations.
